

## The Paralympics

### What is the Paralympics?

The Paralympics is an international sports event where athletes with varying abilities compete in many different sports and represent their home counties. The word 'Paralympic' comes from the words 'Parallel Olympics'. The Paralympics is a parallel event with the Olympic Games and takes place after the Olympic Games in the same city.

Just like the Olympics there is a summer and winter Paralympic Games. There are twenty-two sports in the summer games and five sports in the winter games. The summer sports include wheelchair tennis, swimming, cycling and sitting volleyball. Some winter Paralympic sports include para-snowboarding, wheelchair curling and ice-sled hockey.



### How did it Start?

A competition between veterans with spinal cord injuries started in 1948 and in 1960 sports for people with disabilities were added to the Olympics. Then in 1976 the very first Paralympic Winter Games took place in the country of Sweden.

### Role Models

Paralympic athletes are fantastic role models for everyone. The athletes challenge perceptions of people who have disabilities, sometimes people have a fear of someone who seems 'different'. The Paralympics help change attitudes by showing strong, powerful and talented athletes with all sorts of differences. Some of the values of the games are about acceptance and including all people.
